They are faculty members of University of Maryland.

David Salness, violin, has toured extensively, attaining international recognition as a performer and teacher. His performances have been broadcast by NPR, Bayerische Rundfunk, the British and Canadian Broadcast Corporations. His critically acclaimed recordings are found on the RCA, Telarc and Centaur Labels, among others.

Sally McLain, violin, received her Bachelor and Master of Music degrees with High Distinction from Indiana University. Critically hailed as a "violinist with lots of style" by the Washington Post. Ms. McLain served as concertmaster of the Washington Chamber Symphony for ten seasons and is currently concertmaster of the Washington Concert Opera.

Katherine Murdock, viola, has performed throughout the world with such groups as the Mendelssohn String Quartet, Music from Marlboro, Orpheus Chamber Orchestra, New York Philharmonic and Boston Symphony. She has been a guest of the Guarneri, Emerson and Vermeer string quartets, and has performed live for West German Radio, BBC, NPR's "Performance Today", "St. Paul Sunday" and NBC's "Today Show."

Eric Kutz, cello, has captivated audiences across North America, Europe, and the Middle East. He has diverse collaborations cut across musical styles. He is a founding member of the Murasaki cello-piano Duo. He has performed as a member of the Grant Park Orchestra's cello section, New York Philharmonic, Minnesota and Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra. He holds degrees from the Juilliard School and Rice University.
